4. This was shared at the last FGB of the year with governors. Governors took all responses on board with agreement and encouragement and tasked the Headteacher with preparing a vision statement to satisfy the main themes. Which will be sent back out to stakeholders to decide review and refine.

As part of the research the Headteacher looked at information on what an effective vision statement should be:
